
SUPPLEMENTARY SUBJECT PROGRAMME IN EUROPEAN STUDIES

The Supplementary Subject in European Studies is a one-year programme that aims at giving students a broad knowledge of cultural, political and contemporary historical dimensions of European affairs.

The programme is taught in English and attracts both Danish BA students, and international guest and exchange students from all over the world.

Guest/exchange students may select individual courses or attend the whole programme. There is thus an interdisciplinary and international dimension to this programme

Upon completion of this programme, students have the option of entering the European Studies MA programme (B-line) which offers further possibilities for undertaking interdisciplinary research, understand project-based work, experience an placement or an exchange abroad.

MA IN EUROPEAN STUDIES

The MA in European Studies is a two year programme that aims at giving students a broad knowledge of cultural, sociological, political and contemporary historical dimensions of European affairs. The programme is uniquely interdisciplinary, combining perspectives from both the humanities and the social sciences. At the same time, it focuses on interdisciplinary research training applied in the context of a project based teaching environment where particular attention is paid to intercultural cooperation and teamwork.



The programme is taught in English and recruits students from Denmark as well as internationally. Parts of the programme are also open to international guest and exchange students at the MA level. It typically means that around half the students enrolled come from abroad. This international and intercultural environment is an asset, and is into the set-up of the teaching.

The MA programme includes three semesters of full time course and project work, with and a final thesis written under supervision in the fourth semester.
